

NINETY-NINTH ANNUAL MEETING

On the evening of June 10, 1978, the members of the Tallmadge High School Alumni Association met at Tallmadge High School for the 99th Annual Meeting.

The Social Hour began at 6:00 P.M., with lots of good punch and conversation for all who were there.

The sit-down dinner of Swiss Steak, Baked Potato, Peas, Tossed Salad, relish tray, and all the trimmings, was catered by Stroup's of Akron, in the High School Cafeteria. The tables were covered with the traditional Blue and Gold, which matched the freshly painted room. Special center pieces adorned the head table, the 50 Year table and the 25 Year table.
