Alumni Report

June 11, 1994

On June 11, 1994 201 Alumni, guests and former Teachers met at Tallmadge High School for the 115th annual banquet and meeting.

We began with a social hour at 5:45 P. M. followed by a chicken and beef buffet dinner served by Mel's Catering of Kent, Ohio.

The decorations were blue and gold with gold silk flowers for all. Bags of Panseys decorated the 50 year class tables furnished by Margaret Bumpas (1944). The arrangement committee chaired by Faith Wagner Hause (1943) provided the decorations.

President Richard N. Wood (1948) welcomed the Alumni and their guests

The invocation was given by President Wood.

After dinner and a brief intermission we moved to the Les Bennett room for our meeting and program.

President Wood called the meeting to order at 7:30 P. M.

President Wood introduced all the officers and committees and thanked them for their work.

A special thanks was given John and Daisy Ilg Scalia of A-A Blueprint for donating all of our printing services.

The secretary's Report of the 114th meeting was read and approved.

The Treasurer's Report was read and approved

The Treasurer's Books were audited by Wilma Crites Newlon (1933) and found to be accurate and in order.

Superintendant of Schools Dennis R. Buzzelli gave a very interesting and informative report on the school system.

Mr Buzzelli told us of new programs at the school focusing on parenting and parent skills. Grant for network between students and parents. Guardian Angel Program and Intergenerational Play Program.

They also have a jobs specialist to help graduates find jobs.

On Sunday June 5, 1994 157 seniors graduated from Tallmadge High School at E. J. Thomas Hall on the University of Akron campus.

A minimum of 18 credits are required for graduation. Fifty-two percent of the faculty have master's degrees or better.

The high school library houses over 14,000 print and audio-visual items.

Tallmadge Hi offers learning disabilities support, developmentally handicapped classes and severe behavior disorder handicap programs. Tutoring is available for academic intervention.

Seventy percent of the seniors will attend a 4 year collge, 6% will attend a 2 year college, 8% a trade or Technical College, 5% enter the Military 11% enter the Labor Market.

Tallmadge is a four-year comprehensive high school. There were 750 students in grade 9-12 and 2,551 students in the district. The firstgraduating class in 1879 had eight students. We expect an increase in students in 1994-1995 and there is a possibility they might have to reopen one elementary School.

Extra-Curricular Activities

Academic Challenge Team - in a tournament of 12 schools, Tallmadge placed 4th.

Industrial Technology Club - many fine projects, model house frames clock, coatracks, mass produced Flippers, Castings, metal works of art, and technical drawings.

Vocal Music - Choir performed at the Summit Villa on the Circle, Winter Concert, Festival of Excellence and the Spring Coral Concert. The Choir also made a district tour in December performing at the Middle School, Munroe and Dunbar.

Drama Productions - "Get Witch Quick" and "Guys & Dolls". The drama department was also involved with the community inter-generational production of "Alice in Wonderland". A mime troup has been started which has already performed before audiences.

Marching Band - The Blue Devil Marching Band received excellent ratings at Louisville, Norton and Brunswick Band Competitions. The band performed at Kent Roosevelt's Band Show, all football games and homecoming, Little League and Memorial Day Parades.

Concert Band - held concerts in January, March and April. They participated in the OMEA District VI Solo and Ensemble Contest at Cuyahoga Falls High and received 4 Superior and 3 Excellent ratings. The Band was rated Superior at District VI Band and Chorus Competition held at Springfield High and went on to received an Excellent rating at the Classic Music Festival in Orlando, Fla in March

Jazz Combo - performed at the Festival of Excellence. Students were exposed to jazz improvisation as the major emphasis.

We even had a Class Song of 1944 written by classmate Bernice King Pletcher to the tune of the Victory Polka. This song never made the Hit Parade, but we didn't mind - it was our own. Actually to be honest about it, I don't ever remember having heard it sung.

The Jr/Sr Prom was held at the Mayflower Hotel. Everyone had a good time despite the shortage of male dance partners.

Our last hurrah was the Senior Class Day Program that we put on at the end of the school year for the remainder of the student body. Our program was a minstrel show written by class member Jane Atsberger Garland with the title "Dark Town Jamboree" This was a major production involving the whole class that allowed us to display whatever talent we had or thought we had. We recovered from this effort at a luncheon given for the class after the show by Mrs. John Sperry at the Sperry home on the circle. This large, stately home unfortunately was subsequently replaced by the current Wally Waffle Restaurant.

The MOre formal end to our school careers came with the Baccalaureate Service held on Sunday May 21, 1944 at the Tallmadge Congregational Church in the circle.

This was followed on May 26, 1944 with Commencement held in the old High School Auditorium. The speaker was Judge Frank Harvey, Court of Common Pleas, Akron who addressed the Class on "Responsibilities you Face" The Class Salutatorian was Ileana Crites Williams and the Valedictorian was Karl Starks.

Fifty Years Later -After graduation the Class members quickly went their separate ways and the years have passed in what now seems like the blinking of an eye.

Four our 50th reunion, each class member submitted a biography for inclusion in a Souvenir Book assembled and edited for the occasion by class member Frances Parks Ripley. I have extricated some facts which form sort of a statistical histoy of the Class of 44 since graduation.

27 graduated - 26 alive today 8 live in Tallmadge, 3 in Akron area, 4 California, 2 Florida 2 Georgia 7 spread over individual states from Tenn to Missouri, 26 of 27 married at least once, 7 are currently widows, produced 79 Children, have 143 Grand-children and 8 great grandchildren. 7 out of 7 boys served in military after granduation. 3 girls graduated from Nursing School, 1 girl from Business College, 4 boys earned College Bachelor Degrees and 2 boys earned degrees beyond bachelor level.

A total of 22 Class members are present here this evening. They are Donald Dean, Derwin Richards, John Sperry, Karl Starks, Elinor Ash Griffy, Margaret A. Atwood, Marjorie Ballard Ford, Delores Coontz Hine, Ileana Crites Williams, Betty Davis Kovska, Francis Fenn Salmons, Marjorie Frick Galligan, Mary Goldsmith Rayl, Marie Harmon Geisinger, Bernice King Pletcher, Margaret Orr Bumpas, Frances Parks Ripley, Virginia Walters Wyper, Dorothy Root Parks Gertrude Webster Scherer.

Scholastics - 27 graduating Seniors graduated with honors, 9th Grade proficiency test all passed at Tallmadge. 31 Scholarships were awarded to the graduates. These scholarships are made possible by donations from organizations in Tallmadge.

Mr Buzzelli thanked us for having him as part of our Alumni Meeting and thanked us for continuing to be interested in Tallmadge Schools.

50 Year Class - Class of 1944

The 50 year class report was given by Karl Starks as follows:

On the 27th of May 1944 the Class of 44 attended it's first Tallmadge Alumni Association meeting which was the 65th annual meeting of the Association.

Contrary to current practice, the entire class attended the meeting and was seated as a group on the stage in the old high school auditorium. Our meal and first year dues were paid for by the association.

Tonight, 50 years later, over 80% of the Class of 44 is back to attend the 115th meeting of this association. This time, however, we are paying our own way, We don't mind, though, because in 1944 the average life expectancy was 62.9 years which didn't look well for usmaking our 50 year reunion. In being here tonight we have defied the law of averages.

The Class of 44 started the first grade in 1932 with some 39 eager students. A Miss Blanc was the teacher. By the sixth grade the class had grown to 48 students divided into two classrooms under Mrs. Williams and Miss Hall. By the Ninth grade we were 60 strong divided into two classes with Don Cordier and Gerald Read as the home room teachers.

The Class of 44 completed the 12th grade and graduated 27 students - 7 boys and 20 girls. In this group 2 boys and 3 girls had started in the First Grade.

Needless to say World War II was a major factor in the significant reduction in class size as many male students left for the service before completing their education.

Despite W. W. II and our severely reduced ranks, the Class of 44 managed to complete it's "SENIOR YEAR" doing all the traditional activities that senior classes did in those days and probably still do today.
