Chris then welcomed Superintendent, Jeff Ferguson. Jeff welcomed all the Alumni, saying it was a great pleasure to see everyone. Highlights for 2010-2011 – Academics – rated excellent for the 5th year in a row. On a scale of 1-26 Tallmadge received a perfect score of 26. The traditions, vision and excellence of the school remains the same. We had a great school year and great accomplishments.

At the stadium a new track was installed. Jeff announced that on Tuesday Overdale school would close. An open house from 10-11 am would be held to celebrate the history of the school and to say goodbye. The 2011-2012 building rosters will be as follows: K-2 at Dunbar, 3-5 at Munroe, 6-8 at Middle School and 9-12 at the High School. Closing Overdale would save the school district \$750,000 a year.

Chris then introduced Bob Dieter and Pam Coomes Mullet who gave the 50 year report of the Class of 1961.

Good evening, my name is Bob Dieter and I graduated from Tallmadge in 1961.

Our senior class president, John Bee, wanted to be here to talk; however, he had a scheduling conflict, so you're stuck with me.

A few facts about our class:

We are planning our 50th reunion, which will be held in mid-September here in town.

There were 118 graduates in June of 1961, and to date, we are aware of 16 who have passed away, several this past year.

Of the 102 living, we have located and have current addresses for 92. Not too bad for 50 years of moving around.

Of those 92, - a little more than half (49) live in area code 330 (at least part of the year) and 20 of them are living right here in Tallmadge.

For our reunion, we have invited an additional 10 who were in our grades for most of their school years but did not graduate in 61, however, they were a big part of our lives. We are looking forward to some great memories and a good time at our reunion.

Just a few more facts:

We were the only class to attend every active school building in town during our times. As far as we can tell, everyone started at the old central school in 1st grade, then the next year, the kids in the south end of town went to the new Dunbar building for the second grade on up, while the rest stayed at Central. Overdale opened in 1953 and at some point some of our class went to that building. We all went to the Jr. High together and then to the "Old High School" on North Ave. In the fall of 1960 we were the first senior class to attend the "New" High School on East Ave., so we capped our school days as the "first" in many ways. So some of our class went to each school at Tallmadge grew from 1941 through 1961. It was a good place to grow up and it seemed that you knew almost everybody – or – they knew your parents.

Some school memories of those times:

We had a great marching band and some pretty good sports teams: and Coach Schwabe enthralled us with his stories of flying. We still played our football games at the Overdale field, because the building was the only thing finished on East Ave., but, we had a new gym for basketball.

Our first high school principal, Mr. Ocasek, went on to be a state senator, so we all felt we knew somebody really important.

Another important person, in our driving years, was Capt. Knapp, always the "good cop", as he kept the traffic moving around Lujan's drive-in on the circle.

A & W came about that time, but we didn't cruise their lot, because you had to go out onto West Ave. to get back in. So we just parked and they had more lighting, so the back row at Lujan's had more allure if you had a date.

We always had a new Chevy from West Chevrolet for Drivers ed.

Stow was "the boonies", we were not.

I don't know what else to say except that "ELVIS has left the building". Thank you

At this time we then recognized the 50 year class and presented them with 50 year pins. They were told to pick up their apples after the meeting. The names of all the Golden Agers, anyone graduating 51 years or more was read off by the secretary. They also were given golden delicious apples and were told to pick them up on their way out.

Chris then welcomed the 25 year class of 1986. Representing the class of 1986 was Linda Chiera.

Hello, my name is Linda Chiera and I am a proud member of Tallmadge High School's Class of 1986. I served at our Class Secretary. It is an honor and a privilege to be here with you all this evening. Thank you Mary for the invitation.

Wow, time flies when you're having fun. I did not honestly realize until Mary invited me to present this evening, that it has been 25 years since our class graduated from Tallmadge High School. Life certainly is a journey, not a destination. What a journey it has been. Today we have social networking sites such as Facebook that allows us to connect to our classmates all over the world, 24/7, in a single click. Many of us from the Class of 1986 meet regularly at local restaurants, pubs and parties. Facebook is a great vehicle for us to get the word and reconnect. Mary used Facebook to connect to me about this evening and her I am. Incidentally, email was invented in 1986. So was the 386 series Intel microprocessor. Today, we have iPad's, Blackberry's and 4G networks. Technology has certainly made a significant impact on our lives since 1986.

So has tragedy, I remember the graphic images vividly on a cold January day when I learned that the space shuttle Challenger had exploded. I was in study hall when the announcement was made over the loud speaker. It's hard to believe that in 76 seconds, seven lives were lost. I think this was one of the 1st national tragedies that occurred in my lifetime. One of the astronauts was a teacher, Christa McAlluiffe, the 1st private citizen to ride on a space shuttle mission. I vividly remember conversations with my Technical Drawing Teacher, Mr. Bliss. He mentioned that he was under consideration for this prestigious mission. I also vividly remember the disappointment he shared when he learned that he did not make the cut. I can only imagine the thoughts that went through Mr. Bliss' head when he learned of this tragedy.

In February 1986 an earthquake shook the walls, floors and students of Tallmadge High School. This was a 5 point magnitude and the largest earthquake in Tallmadge's history. I was in Art Class when this happened. It is predicted that another earthquake of this kind will occur 50 years later, in 2036. That gives us another 25 years to prepare. Who knows, I or another classmate may be saying "do you remember when..." at our 50th THS Alumni celebration.

Speaking of rock and roll, Cleveland was named the Home of Rock n Roll in 1986. The first – 10 inductees were inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. Today 296 inductees are honored there. Music, particularly rock n roll has played a significant part in my life. Songs and music video's like "Walk like an Egyptian", "How Will I Know" and "Rock me Amadeus" scream 1986. I remember Mrs. Caswell, my English Teacher and Tennis coach saying that she did not understand songs today. She felt bad that we were gipped and that songs in 1986 could not possibly have an impact like the songs of her era. Well, Mrs. Caswell, from my experience, they did make a significant impact. Today, I believe that music is a huge connector, regardless of the generation.

Life definitely is a journey...so what have I learned since 1986 – that High School was a challenging time. Being a teenager was a challenging time. Today I know that Life can be challenging and is also filled with tremendous growth opportunities to overcome for All. I have learned that we all are connected some way, somehow to each other. Whether it is through technology, tragedy, natural disasters or the arts and entertainment, we are all connected. We all have experienced joy, wonder, fascination, loss, grief, shock, surprise, anger, victory, hope and love. Life happens. I have learned to slow down: to live, to breathe and to keep an open mind. I have also learned to take a look around me and to be grateful for every experience and everyone who has crossed my path.
